

**RULES AND REGULATIONS
FOR THE MARYLAND
4-H VISUAL PRESENTATION/DEMONSTRATION PROGRAM**

GENERAL

1. The participant must be enrolled in county 4-H program. This means a signed enrollment card on file in the County Extension Office or club membership list as submitted by local leader in County Extension Office.
2. **Age Junior Division** - the club member must be 8 years old during the current year, and must not have passed his or her 10th birthday before January 1 of the current year.
3. **Age Intermediate Division** - the club member must be 11 years old before January 1 of the current year and must not have passed his or her 14 birthday before January 1.
4. **Age Senior Division** - the club member must be 14 years old before January 1 of the current year and must not have passed his or her 19th birthday before January 1.
5. A club member may compete in only one class in any one year.
6. **Length of Visual Presentation - Junior Division and Intermediate Division:** At least 5 minutes but not to exceed 10 minutes; **Senior Division:** At least 10 minutes but not to exceed 15 minutes. Finished products should be displayed during the allotted time for the presentation.
7. **Equipment and supplies** - participants must furnish all their own equipment and supplies. Range, microwave and refrigerator will not be provided. Come prepared to demonstrate without them. A table and easel is provided for all presentations.

9. The team and individual presentation in each class will be judged by the modified group method according to merit as: Excellent, Very Good, Good. Those placing in the "Excellent" group will receive Blue Ribbons, the "Very Good" group will receive Red Ribbons, and the "Good" group White Ribbons.
10. If one or more presentations in a class are judged in the "Excellent" group, judges may name a Champion at their discretion.
11. ***If contestant wishes to be considered for a specialty demonstration area that takes place at State Fair, or other State event, you must let your intent be known at the county contest when entering your information, example State Egg Preparation, State Horticulture, Horse Communications, etc.***
